Dear Friends in Christ,

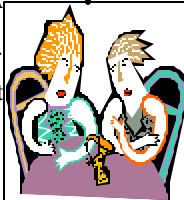
As you know, we've been reviewing our church vision statement in our Sunday morning services. (A short description of that statement is at the end of this article - check it out!).

It's divinely appropriate that our Mission Conference occurs in the midst of this series: our vision supports our mission, at home and abroad. Let's consider for a minute the many ways that our church reaches into our world.

This year, we have supported, to some degree, six families on the field in Africa, Eastern Europe and South America. As of this writing, we have helped seven other families/individuals participate in short-term mission trips. We give regularly to leadership training institutions

like United Wesleyan Graduate Institute and Latin America Leadership that trains pastors for service in their home countries.

Closer to home, we support our chaplains. We have mentored and support our church-mothering project, Hebron Methodist Church. In addition, we give regularly to a wide variety of ministries including AA Pregnancy Help Center, Child Evangelism Fellowship, Wilmore/High Bridge Community Center, Wilmore Daycare, Eagle Ridge Retreat Center, Francis Asbury Society, and Oakdale Christian School.



*There is a place for everyone in Evangelism; it's the mission of the church - we have no choice but to participate.*

These and other para-church ministries do things that we, as a church, can't do alone, but that need to be done.

So far this year, through our benevolence ministry, we have given away nearly \$5000.00 to persons in our community that need help with clothes, utilities, rent, medicine and other necessities. Through our compassion ministry, we've

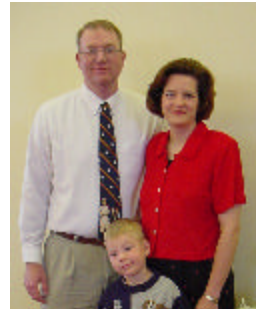

This summer Clint, Madeline and I traveled to Hong Kong and mainland China to teach in an English camp. At least 10 high school students made first time commitments to Jesus!

Two snapshots of our trip-- Over 60,000 Filipino women immigrate to Hong Kong seeking jobs as housekeepers and nannies. The women leave behind their children and husbands in order to have a job and send money to support their families.

We went to visit the 1st Filipino Free Methodist Church of Hong Kong. As we entered the church, we were greeted by bright, smiling faces of over one hundred women. I saw Christ's face clearly on the faces of these women. Several of them cried as they talked about the difficulty of only knowing husbands and children over the phone. As they sang something like "Today, all over the world, people are singing to Jesus," I realized my own

**O**ur lives present many battles—many of which we cannot victoriously fight alone. 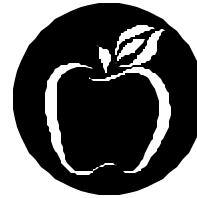
Some were without feet, hands, or fingers, and some with their eyes sown almost shut to preserve a spot of sight. We had a meal with them and afterward our team sang some songs. One man without hands clapped along with us using his wrists, and a smile spilled out all over his face. Again I saw the face of Jesus.

We come back from our trip knowing more of Jesus and a sense that the world is smaller than we thought, and yet the kingdom is bigger than we ever imagined. Thank you for your financial and prayer support of our ministry.

helped with funerals, provided transportation to doctors appointments, and provided literally hundreds of meals for families in the church and community in need.

We have just published a new Servant Evangelism schedule which will give all of us opportunities to join in an organized effort toward reaching the lost in our community. Anyone can do this – you do not have to be an apostle! In addition to the scheduled events, there will be some street evangelism opportunities available from time to time for the more daring among us. There is a place for everyone in Evangelism; it's the mission of the church – we have no choice but to participate. Direct any questions to

a staff member, or talk to David Goss, Evangelism Team Leader.

WFMC is constantly training ministers; students at Asbury Theological Seminary and Asbury College who are called of God and plan to enter the ministry, come to us for mentoring, training and ministry experience. In the relatively short life of our church (since the 1950's), we have sent hundreds of pastors, missionaries, campus ministers, teachers and other ministers into the world.

Please understand, I write these things not to pat ourselves on the back, but to make you, the church family, aware of the ways we reach into our community

and world. Sometimes, as we make it a practice to give, "not letting our left hand know what our right hand is doing," some of us are left not knowing the full extent of our ministry. I want you to know how we use the money you give, so we can all rejoice and participate in the Lord's rewards. **Pastor Daryl**

**WFMC Vision Statement**

**Worshipping Truly** – Individually and as a church, we strive to worship Christ truly. This has little to do with our liturgical and musical forms, styles, and preferences. True worship is determined by the condition of our attitude and heart as we come before our holy God. "Are we singing, praying, giving and listening in the Spirit? (John 4:24) Are we repentant and contrite? Are we seeking His purposes and His pleasure? Are we lifting Him up?" These are questions true worshippers ask frequently, and goals they strive toward daily.

**Obeying Fully** – "To obey is better than sacrifice." (1 Samuel 15:22) In order to please God, He asks us to discern His will and obey Him fully in all areas, with no hesitation. Full obedience to His Word in attitude, word and lifestyle is our goal.

**Serving Joyfully** – Joyful service to God is evidence of a faith that is alive and of a heart warmed with the Holy Spirit (James 2). Joyful service is also the way we work out our salvation. Whether it's service to one another, service to the church or to the community, or service to the "least of these," we seek to serve wherever and however our Lord calls us, with joy.

**Watching Expectantly** -- We have a hope for the future. We watch expectantly for Christ's return to earth to declare final victory over the powers of sin and death (Revelation 22:12). While God has given us power to live victoriously over the entanglements of sin here and now, there is coming a day when His glory will be revealed and everyone will see that Christ is King. We work, wait, and watch expectantly for that day.

**Being Christ's Presence In The World** This is the charge we were given until Christ returns - feeding His sheep, taking care of His lambs, and telling others about His great love and mercy. We are to be light in a dark world, salt in a tasteless land - as He was while He walked with us here on earth. The presence of a Christian should reflect the presence of Christ - it is to this we strive.

Adam and Rebecca Vincent just finished two years of service with English Language Institute/China, teaching English in Tong Hua Teacher's College working with first and second-year students. They are currently on home assignment sharing God's vision for their future. They plan to move to Seoul, Korea, in January 2005 to begin learning the Korean language. This is part of a larger plan of networking with the Korean people to find an opening into the North. They hope to open an organization in North Korea that will provide aid and education to the poor.

The Vincents have family in Kansas and Illinois, and their first child, Kaiden, was born on September 8, 2004. Adam received his bachelor's degree from Central College in McPherson, Kansas. Prior to teaching in China, he was a youth leader in McPherson. Rebecca graduated from the University of Illinois – Champaign/Urbana and was an employee of Abbott Laboratories in McPherson. They are both currently working on MBAs in International Economic Development from Eastern College in Pennsylvania, and look forward to using their education in Korea.



David Roller is the area director for Latin America for Free Methodist World Missions and is responsible for administration and leadership development in 21 Latin American countries. David and his wife, Yvonne, give special attention to the 13 young mission districts in Latin America which are experiencing rapid growth. Prior to their arrival in Chile in 1997, the Rollers served for 17 years in Nogales, Mexico. During their Mexican ministry, they established a prototype cell-church model in Nogales and were instrumental in the development of an international retreat center (Rancho Betania) used by Mexican Free Methodists, schools, government groups, and churches from different denominations.

The Rollers have two children, Thaddeus and Evangeline, both students at Spring Arbor University, the alma mater of their parents. David is also a graduate of Asbury Seminary. David is the son of Gilbert and Jeri Roller, our Ministers of Pastoral Care.



Eric Spangler serves as the Director of Mobilization for Free Methodist World Missions. In this role, Rev. Spangler is responsible for mobilizing the North American church to have a global perspective and mobilizing new missionaries to serve in the place God has for them. Eric speaks in churches and on college campuses internationally.

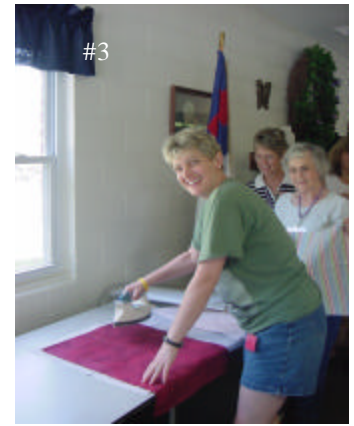

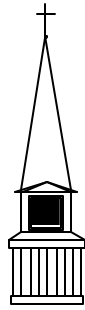

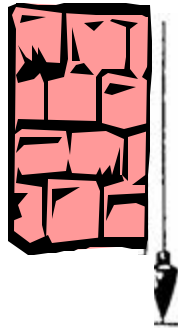
