Things to Look For in 2012

Nostradamus I am not. I'm not even Carnac the Magnificent. I will, however, make a few predictions here about things that will affect the life of our church family in this new year.

A Good Thing – Thanks to Pastor Dwight, Ed Bryson, Linda Henson, and Duane Brown, we will begin offering a full slate of elective classes and seminars during the Sunday education hour, on Wednesday nights, and on Saturday mornings. No doubt you've seen the great stuff we're starting with: "Making \$ense of Global Economics," "An Insider's Perspective of Hospice," and "Making and Being Disciples." These are designed to be Biblical approaches to some practical problems we all face. Look for the subjects to come in your weekly worship folder.

A Not-So-Good Thing – It looks as though we can expect another volatile year in the worlds of national and global finance and Middle East peace. This year, the world will realize how close much of Europe is to the brink of financial disaster and how some of those nations' troubles will spread around the globe. The nuclear arming of Iran - along with the situations in Egypt, Iraq, Libya, Syria, and other Arab Spring events - will no doubt keep our eyes not only eastward but upward as well. This will be a year of uncertainty, but uncertainty around us reminds us that the only sure thing is what we have in Christ.

A Good Thing – As I write, the Construction Planning Team will soon be completing the final details of our building expansion project, and after final approval of the Board of Administration and Society, we'll begin construction as soon as possible. Because the Lord has provided for us, this will be a year full of exciting decisions and much needed expansion in facility and ministry.

A Not-So-Good Thing – More and more folk come to our church for financial help. We wish this wasn't the case – that so many are in need in these days. Some come with genuine needs due to unemployment or underemployment, and we are excited to be in a position to help them and show them Christ. Others, frankly, come to try to take advantage of our generosity. Would you pray for the Benevolence Team, particularly on interview days (Tuesdays and Thursdays), that we would have the wisdom of the Lord to know how best to help all who come to our church for assistance?

A Good Thing – Just about every Sunday, at least several new families join us for worship. They come for different reasons, but all have some sort of need that they are giving us (and the Lord through us) the opportunity to meet. As you look around you (on Sunday morning especially) and see someone you don't know or recognize, please take the initiative to introduce yourself and speak a word of welcome. Invite them to your ABF or Sunday evening worship or Wednesday night or a Women's event or a Men's Breakfast or some other event where they can get to know, and be known by, others. It's hard to be the new person. We all need to do what we can to open the doors of fellowship to those who are knocking.

It's been said that an optimist sees nothing but a rosy world, and a pessimist nothing but the thorns.

I think Christians are called to be realists, and to me, a realist admits that, though there be thorns in the present, the future is always rosy.

The fact is, our world can be a difficult place. Yet God is good, and He is here and active in our lives...and He will prevail...and we will prevail in Him.

May 13th: 6:00 p.m. - Singing Celebration VIII, led by the Sanctuary and Youth Choirs

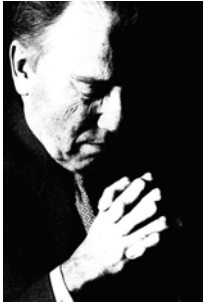

Lowell and Naomi Williamson

The Williamsons moved to Wilmore last November and right into the fellowship of the WFMC family. They live in Bethel Pointe near their daughter, Renae Thompson, and grandchildren Tyler, Stuart, and Jessie.

Lowell and Naomi grew up in Christian families: he on a farm in Ohio and she on a farm in Kansas. Both received Christ as children and felt a call to missions at an early age.



“I thought this would mean being an old maid, wearing my hair in a bun, and playing an accordion,” says Naomi. After “doing her own thing” in high school, she committed to a renewed call during

her first year at Asbury College.

Naomi and Lowell met at Asbury in 1955. He had attended from 1947 to 1949 and left college to pastor two rural churches in Upper Sandusky OH. “God’s call came to me through the words of Acts 5:20 to ‘Go, stand, and speak,’” says Lowell, who also served with OMS in Japan for three years doing tent crusades, literature distribution, and evangelism before returning to Asbury. After graduating, he attended Western Evangelical Seminary in Portland OR and maintained a long-distance courtship with Naomi for a year. They married in 1956 after her graduation from Asbury and two years later went to Taiwan with one-year-old Rodney – and an accordion presented by Sunday school children in Portland (but no bun).

The Williamsons served with OMS in Taiwan until 1994, pastored in Portland for three years, lived in Greenwood IN while Lowell served as OMS regional director for six Asian countries (1997- 2006), and served the church in China while living in Taiwan (2006-2009). He still serves house churches in China, chairing a partnership board that advises leaders and helps them find resources.

The Williamsons listened last year when Rodney (who now serves in Taiwan) and Renae told them they needed to move to Wilmore near Renae and her family. They are happy to be grandparenting now from across the street rather than from halfway around the world.

The Prochina family household encompasses three generations: Leslie and Carole: daughters, Lora (11) and Lily (6); and grandparents, Jose and Conchita Prochina. They have attended WFMC for three years, since the closing of Open Door FMC.

Leslie and Carole grew up in the Philippines, he as the son of a Free Methodist pastor in Mindanao and she as the daughter of FM missionaries, David and Sherrill Yardy. They became acquainted through youth groups, summer camps, and Bible College. When Carole came to Asbury College, they maintained long-distance contact through phone calls and emails. He even proposed by phone from the Philippines. They were married June 20, 1998, at his home church in Cagayan de Oro (“City of Golden Friendship”). Nine months later, after maneuvering a mountain of paperwork, they moved to Wilmore, where Carole pursued dual degrees at Asbury and UK while Leslie worked. He later enrolled at Bluegrass Community Technical College. Both now work as RNs at UK’s Chandler and Good Samaritan Hospitals, Leslie full time and Carole part-time.

Carole also homeschools Lora and Lily.

Les and Carole are members of the Café Berea ABF taught by Fred Long, and Carole serves as

assistant teacher of the kindergarten CLC class on Wednesday night. Les enjoys playing with the men’s basketball group. Lora sings in the youth choir, plays handbells, and is a rookie Bible quizzer. Lily sings with the Friendship Company.

Monday night is family night at the Prochinas’.

This may mean games or a movie and ice cream or a drive. The Prochinas enjoy travel. Their latest trip was in December, driving to Manhattan (NYC) and to Maryland to visit family. Some day they want to drive Route 66 all the way to California.


“Right now our focus is on our kids,” says Les. “We want to be good examples to them, and we pray they will grow up to be strong Christians—even leaders. We are thankful for this good church with all of its programs for children.”

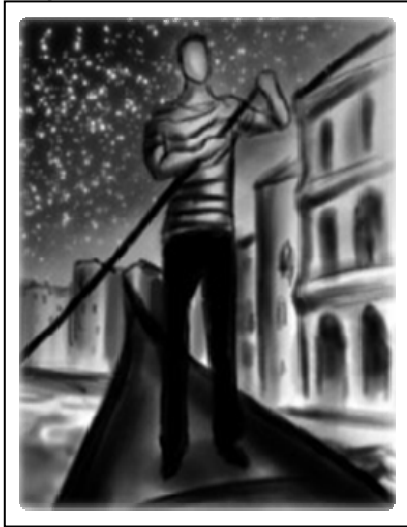
